





that interacts with Dreamweaver to allow for webpage editing via the web. It is billed as 'The smarter CMS platform focused on providing a seamless workflow from design to content creation'. Users can join in the action by heading to www.konductor.net to sign up for a free Konductor account. Here users are provided with a unique URL and download links to the Dreamweaver extension and the Konductor AIR app. It is the installed Dreamwever extension that provides the link between the software and the Konductor AIR app. Designers

create a template with any number of editable regions under the banner of New Konductor Site, which provides the necessary connection details. Templates are then synchronised with Konductor ready for use.

The Konductor AIR app needs Abode AIR installed (http:// get.adobe.com/air/) and uses any uploaded Dreamweaver templates as the basis of a page. The templates leave the desired design intact while allowing multiple users to edit the predetermined regions. The perfect platform for designers to create and non-designers to edit.



Create a custom template for Konductor CMS




01 Register

The very first step is to head on over to http://www.konductor.net/register and register for a Konductor account. Fill out the registration form, pay attention to Your first site ID as this is the name that will be used to reach a conductor site. To finish up click the 'I accept. Create my account' button.



04 Open HTML page

After entering Konductor details press OK and choose the local root folder to place the Konductor website files. If a new folder is to be used, create it before opening the Konductor extension. Now press Select and open the file to be used as the template for the site. Alternatively, create a site from scratch.




07 Smart regions

Each editable region can be further modified by first clicking in the associated tab. For example, the top menu region we created can be modified by selecting Menu Region. This will then overwrite any existing code. Select menu, a menu direction, menu depth and the new CSS will be added.




02 Download

Konductor offers two ways to download its Dreamweaver extension and AIR application. These can be downloaded immediately after creating an account. Alternatively, following Konductor email instructions log in and click on the Downloads tab and download both. Double-click the .mxp file to install the Dreamweaver extension.




05 Template-ify

The basic HTML file needs to be turned into a Dreamweaver template, so the first step is to add editable regions. First select the element that needs to be editable, ie text, and head to the Insert menu. Now select Template Objects>Editable Region, which will display 'Dreamweaver will automatically convert...', press OK to continue.



08 Save template

Now select the keyboard shortcut Ctrl/Cmnd+S to save the file and activate the Save As Template dialog window. The Site drop-down box will have the name of the Konductor site displayed and the name of the template in the Save As field. Rename and add a description if desired and press Save.



03 Konductor site definition

Once the extension has been installed a new Konductor addition appears in the Site menu. Select Site>New Konductor Site to open the Site Definition dialog window. Now enter the name of the site created in the registration process, the URL, ie http://webdesignermag.konductor.net and the username and password created previously.



06 Edit region


By default, Dreamweaver will name the New Editable Region EditRegion1. Change the name to a more relevant and recognisable title and press OK. Now repeat the process for all the elements that need to be editable within the template. And again give all elements a relevant and recognisable name.



09 Synchronize Sitewide

To connect with Konductor and upload any files, first go to Site>Synchronize Sitewide to open the Synchronize Files window. For first-time users select Entire... from the Synchronize drop-down list and Put newer files to remote... from the Direction drop-down list and press Preview to continue.






10 Start Synchronize

Dreamweaver will now go through the connection process and present a list of the files currently within the site definition. As this is the first time, all the files need to be uploaded. Press OK and the Background File Activity window will display the progress of the files being uploaded until complete.




13 Change template

By default, Konductor will be displaying the default templates. Select Homepage and the page properties will appear in the bottom of the screen. To change the template press Change Template, select the appropriate template and press Change. Apply to all pages. To preview the new-look homepage, hit the Preview icon.



16 Changing text

All the editable regions will be outlined in blue to indicate what is available to edit. To edit an element click the appropriate box and the Properties will appear at the bottom of the screen. If the editable region is text, simply type in the replacement text. Now click Save And Preview followed by Preview in Browser to view changes.



11 Synchronize options

The initial sync process will send all files to the server. Subsequent synchronisation will act slightly differently. Repeat the previous step and only updated files will appear in the list. Click Show all files to view all files. To change a file's status use the buttons in the bottom-left corner, ie Ignore to stop file being synchronised.



14 Homepage

The homepage can be modified to suit your individual wishes; first select the page name, change to index and press Apply. Now click Page Meta Data, add a page title, page description, page keywords and press OK. Now click the Edit icon in the bottom-right corner to start editing the template.




17 Upload assets

Before changing the default image to the actual image, the image needs to be uploaded to the Assets section of Konductor. Close the Edit window and click the Assets button on the main window. Now click the Upload Asset icon, locate the desired asset, select and press Open. The asset is then uploaded to the Assets section ready to use.



12 Konductor login

All the files within the defined site will now have been uploaded and placed in the appropriate Konductor folder. Now open the Kondcutor AIR app icon, there should be a shortcut on the desktop. Add the Site Name, Username, Password and press Login to enter the Konductor app and view the home screen.



15 Edit menu text

At the top of the template file is the menu text ready to be edited. Select the text of the first link and the Properties window will display all the various options. Click Internal to display all the pages currently available with the Konductor site. Select a page and press Apply. Repeat this process for the links in the menu.



18 Replace image

Now click All Pages, select the index file and double-click or press Edit in the bottom-right corner to open the edit window. Select an image to activate Image Properties. Click Replace Image and the Asset Library will appear, select the desired asset and press Insert to add the new image. Now press Save changes to save the page.



19 Image properties

After an image has been put in place, Konductor allows users to perform modifications. Add an Alt tag for better accessibility, click External Link to add a link to an external URL and call up Text Wrapping if text needs to be aligned next to an image. If an image has been resized, click Reset Image size to go back to the original dimensions.



21 Add new pages

By definition the additional pages may not be enough for all the pages needed in a bespoke site. To add a single new page, select All Pages and click the Add Page icon. Select the desired template from the Add Page dialog window, give it a new page name and press Add to add to the current collection.




20 Existing pages

By default, Konductor adds a number of existing pages. These should have the new template applied. If this is the case then some work may be needed, eg in step 15 the menu text was edited with links added. However, this will only apply to one page, all existing pages will need updating. Select, click Edit and add links as before.



22 Add multiple pages

Adding multiple pages is very similar to adding a single page. First, click the Add Multiple icon to open the related window. Now use the up and down arrows to choose the desired number of pages. Give the pages a name, ie product, select the desired template and press Add. The pages will be added and named eg, product 1, product 2.



23 Save and Preview

Now populate the new pages by selecting and clicking Edit. Once the text and images have been modified press Save Changes, wait and press Preview in Browser to see the finished page. Finally, close down, select All Pages and add Site Meta Data to make the site more search-engine friendly.

IN DETAIL

Managing Konductor sites more effectively

The Konductor content management platform has many faces. Here we look at how to set up and manage Design and Client accounts

*** THE KONDUCTOR CONTENT management platform is a *** multi-talented beast and provides a lot more than we have touched on in the tutorial. Principally the platform was built for designers to create templates that can be edited by multiple online users. The current Dreamweaver extension effectively provides the upload link between the local files and the online Konductor app. The Adobe AIR application is where the fun really begins. This allows users to take control of content without destroying the beautifully created Dreamweaver templates. Users can simply keep adding new templates to create a fully customised bespoke web solution.

However, it is away from the two design components that there is greater control over Konductor. Once a Konductor account has been created users can log in as a Designer or Client. The Designer login allows users to manage current sites, create new ones and edit account details. Once logged in users see a list of sites which give direct access to the URL, webdesigner.konductor.net and its status. Users can send access information directly via email to other users. There is an Edit button that also allows account holders to change details. In addition to the listing there is a Create a New Site button. Click this and users can add a new title and add details of the Master Administrator, this will need to be someone with a Konductor account. This will create a new site with the new prefix and Konductor domain, ie mynewsite. konductor.net. The new site will currently be empty as no Dreamweaver templates have been initiated. So, users need to head back to Dreamweaver to create a New Konductor Site with the appropriate details. Then it's a matter of creating the appropriate templates and synchronising with Konductor. Users can then log in and start adding pages.

The Client login is the administrators account area. Here administrators can edit profiles, check history and delete accounts. There is the option to Create a New Admin directly from within the account area. Manage Site allows for the Site Title to be modified and the option to Set Google Analytics Script. Plus, this is where all billing information will appear when the website is fully active. Unfortunately, there is no mention of pricing currently.
